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Exercise 1: Role-Playing Exercises

Exercise 1.1: Customer and Service Provider Interaction

Instructions: Pair up with a classmate. One of you will be the customer, and the other will be the store manager. Use the prompts below to guide your conversation.

Customer:

- Greet the manager and explain the reason for your visit.
- Describe the problem with the product you purchased.
- Express your disappointment politely and ask for a possible solution.
- Respond to the manager's suggestions and negotiate a satisfactory outcome.
- Thank the manager and conclude the conversation.

Store Manager:

- Greet the customer and ask how you can assist them.
- Listen to the customer's complaint and show empathy.
- Offer a solution such as a refund, exchange, or repair.
- Handle any objections or additional requests from the customer.

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- Close the conversation by thanking the customer for visiting.

Exercise 1.2: Doctor-Patient Consultation

Instructions: Switch roles with your partner. The new 'doctor' will diagnose the 'patient' based on their symptoms.

Patient:

- Describe your symptoms to the doctor.
- Answer the doctor's questions about your medical history.
- Ask about the possible causes of your symptoms.
- Inquire about treatment options.
- Discuss follow-up steps and express your thanks.

Doctor:

- Ask the patient about their symptoms.
- Inquire about the patient's medical history and lifestyle.
- Explain the possible diagnosis in a way the patient can understand.
- Suggest treatment options and explain the benefits and side effects.
- Advise on follow-up steps and reassure the patient.

Exercise 1.3: Job Interview Simulation

Instructions: Maintain your roles. The 'interviewer' will ask questions, and the 'candidate' will respond as if in a job interview.

Interviewer:

- Start by introducing yourself and explaining the interview process.
- Ask the candidate to tell you about themselves.
- Inquire about the candidate's experience in the relevant field.
- Ask the candidate why they are interested in this position.
- Question the candidate about their strengths and weaknesses.
- Discuss a challenging situation the candidate has faced at work and how they dealt with it.
- Ask the candidate where they see themselves in five years.

- Inquire if the candidate has any questions about the company or position.
- Explain the next steps in the hiring process.
- Thank the candidate for their time and conclude the interview.

Candidate:

- Greet the interviewer and introduce yourself.
- Provide a summary of your professional background.
- Highlight your relevant experience and skills.
- Explain your interest in the job and the company.
- Discuss your strengths and how you're addressing your weaknesses.
- Describe a challenging work situation and how you overcame it.
- Share your career goals for the next five years.
- Ask insightful questions about the company and the role.
- Express your enthusiasm for the opportunity.
- Thank the interviewer and ask about the next steps.

Exercise 2: Debate Exercises

Exercise 2.1: Technology in the Workplace

Instructions: Form two groups. One group will argue for the benefits of remote working, while the other will advocate for in-office working. Use the statements below to support your arguments and develop counterarguments.

Group A - Remote Working:

- Argue how remote working can improve work-life balance.

Exercise 5: Interview Exercises

Talk Show Host:

Exercise 5.2: The Opinion Panel

Instructions: Form a panel with a group of learners. The rest of the class will act as the audience and ask questions. Use the prompts below to guide the panel discussion.

Panel Members:

- Introduce yourself and your area of interest or expertise.
- Share your opinion on a current hot topic (the audience will provide the topic).
- Discuss your perspective on the implications of this topic.
- Debate the topic with fellow panel members respectfully.
- Answer questions from the audience clearly and concisely.
- Discuss potential solutions or actions related to the topic.

Audience Members:
